- \$36 million worth of memorabilia sold through Sotheby's, including records for the bat Babe Ruth used to hit the very first home run at Yankee Stadium—\$1.25 million, and the contract selling Ruth from the Red Sox to the Yankees, \$996,000.
- Other collections sold include estates of Casey Stengel, Pee Wee Reese, Billy Martin, Secretariat (really!) and Arthur Ashe and the collections of Muhammad Ali, Joe Frazier and the largest antique golf club collection in the world.
- Appraisals include: the World Champion New York Yankees Museum at Yankee Stadium, champion Floyd Mayweather's boxing memorabilia and donations to The National Baseball Hall of Fame at Cooperstown.
